CUO ORGANIZES AWARENESS CAMPAIGN IN ADOPTED VILLAGES

Central University of Orissa organized an awareness campaign in it's adopted villages – Rajapalama, Nuaguda and Chakarliput on 6th May, 2018. The University has already undertaken various development activities in its adopted villages.
